

When he died, the nation was plunged into uncertainty.


The Assyrians were threatening





2. The Focus of Worship

Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying - Isaiah 6:1-2.





The Results of Encountering God

I. Encountering God leads to Worship

And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke — Isaiah 6:3-4.



Holy means

to be set apart.
utterly pure, separated from sin.

Implication

holiness and sin cannot coexist

to admire God,
to bow down,
to reverence,
to kiss the hand of,
to ascribe worth to,
to thank.








II. Encountering God leads to Confession


"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty" -Isaiah 6:5.





II. Encountering God leads to Confession


We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all — Isaiah 53:6.





II. Encountering God leads to Confession

The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it? – Jeremiah 17:9.





III. Encountering God leads to Cleansing

Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for" (v. 6-7).

. . . as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us (Ps 103: 12)



III. Encountering God leads to Cleansing

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness (I John 1: 9).



IV. Encountering God leads to Commissioning

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah 6:8.
